### **Collision on Queens Line involving Paramedic Crew**

**CHATHAM-KENT, ON - July 3, 2013,** At approximately 10:00am this morning one of our paramedic crews were involved in a motor vehicle collision involving one other vehicle on the Queens Line, near the highway 401 overpass.

The collision resulted in the both paramedics and the driver of the other vehicle to be transported to local hospitals for their injuries. The paramedic driver was transported to Hotel Dieu in Windsor and is currently stable. The other paramedic was transported to Public General Hospital also in stable condition. The driver of the other vehicle and was transported to London via ORNGE air ambulance.

“Our current priority and concern is focused on the employees involved, their families and the patient in the other vehicle. We are providing support and resources to everyone involved at this time and are wishing for positive outcomes” says Steve Pancino, General Manager of Medavie EMS Ontario Chatham-Kent
